## Food Security and Nutrition

Leverage access to food and nutrition security through support of protein ingredients, chicken meat, and eggs for free school lunch. Cooperate with Suranaree University of Technology and Burapha University to implement the agricultural lunch project by supporting equipment, knowledge, and agricultural innovations to produce raw materials for school lunches and promote nutrition knowledge, healthy eating habits, and good nutrition in Thai children.

## Water Management

Promote safe rice cultivation methods and develop agricultural practices to promote safe rice cultivation through water management, technologies, and agricultural innovation. Enhance access to clean water by delivering drinking water systems to 200 schools by 2025.

## Climate Change

Promote the prevention of organic waste and plastic leakage into the sea through the reduction and management of waste in communities, academic institutes, and business sectors that are located nearby the sea through cooperation with the United Nations Development Program (UNDP) and Suratthani Rajabhat University and development of an environmentally friendly food production chain by supporting a purchase of raw materials for animal feed, especially from a source which does not destroy the environment.
